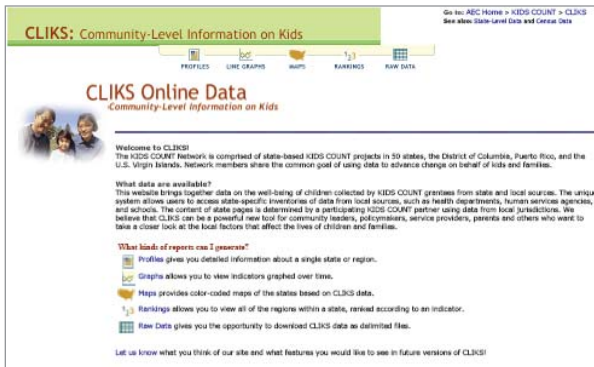

- For a line graph, you may select up to 8 regions within a state (to include Kansas, check the box above Allen County)
- To access the counties, scroll down to Kansas and click the "+" sign to the left. This will expand to appear like below.

NOTES

The timeframe in which each indicator's data is collected varies. The most recent data available for each indicator is referred to as the "current year" (e.g. the current year for poverty is 2004 whereas the current year for Head Start is 2006).

After creating a custom report, the web address will be unique to that specific report. This allows users to share that link so others may view the report you created.

The respective data notes and sources will always appear at the bottom of the page when you generate a report.



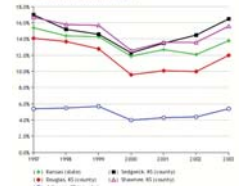
PROFILE

The profile will default to show the most recent five years data are available. If data exists for additional years, there will be a link in the header to view all years data are available.



LINE GRAPH

The graph will automatically use the most recent five years of data. To adjust the timeframe, use the drop down menus above the graph to modify the years shown.

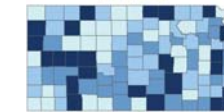


To insert the line graph in a document, right click on the graph then either copy and paste or save it as a picture.



MAP

To change the year displayed, use the drop down menu above the map. To change the size of the map or to change it from color to patterns, use the drop down menu below the map.



RANKING

To change the year or highlight a county so it's easy to find among the list, use the drop down menus above the ranking.

The top 50 and bottom 50 are automatically displayed. To view the full list, go to the middle of the list and click to expand the view to all counties.



RAW DATA

You will be asked to open an excel file which contains all years of available data for the indicator you selected.
